Biosecurity advice for pig farmers





Limit people's access to your pigs

 Take appropriate biosecurity measures and ensure that those who must come in contact with your pigs change to clean footwear, overalls etc. This is especially important for visitors who have recently been on farms abroad.

If you have been in contact with domestic or wild animals in other countries, wait 48 hours before entering an Icelandic holding.

- Shower and wash your hair after you have been in another country before entering a farm in Iceland.
- Wash clothes that have come in contact with animals in other countries (at least 60°C), and clean and disinfect footwear.

Do not give food or food leftovers to animals, regardless the origin of the food.

If your pigs have disease symptoms indicating serious pig diseases, you must immediately report it to Mast.

- <u>Typical signs of African Swine Fever and Classical Swine Fever are:</u> high fever, decreased appetite, skin discoloration and sudden death.
- o <u>The main symptoms of Foot and Mouth Disease are:</u> fever, blisters on feet and snout, and sudden death of piglets.
