Icelandic legislation on import of animals

According to Icelandic Act no. 54/1990 on import of animals **it is prohibited** to import animals to Iceland. Certain exemptions do apply, as for importation of dogs and cats that fulfill all <u>import requirements</u> regarding health and quarantine according to regulation no. 200/2020 on the import of cats and dogs.

Animals on board carriers (vessels / aircrafts) that dock or transit in Iceland, are not under any circumstances allowed to leave the carrier. An exemption applies to Keflavik airport where there is a transit facility for pets in the terminal building. This is managed by the ground service personnel. If necessary, during transit in Keflavik airport, pets are to be transported in an IATA approved transport crate directly between the airplane and the transit facility where they can relieve themselves and be fed.

If animals are released or break out of a carrier docking or transiting in Iceland, this is considered illegal importation and will be dealt with appropriately by the authorities.
